THIS BLEND OF ECONOMIC INTERESTS AND RELIGIOUS FERVOR UNDERPINNED MUCH OF THE EXPLORATION ACTIVITY DURING THIS PERIOD.

MAJOR EXPLORERS AND THEIR VOYAGES

VASCO DA GAMA'S SUCCESSFUL VOYAGE AROUND THE CAPE OF GOOD HOPE TO INDIA IN 1498 ESTABLISHED A DIRECT SEA ROUTE FROM EUROPE TO ASIA. THIS BREAKTHROUGH ALLOWED PORTUGAL TO DOMINATE THE SPICE TRADE AND ESTABLISH A COLONIAL FOOTHOLD IN THE INDIAN OCEAN, IMPACTING REGIONAL POLITICS AND COMMERCE SIGNIFICANTLY.

FERDINAND MAGELLAN

ALTHOUGH MAGELLAN HIMSELF DIED DURING THE EXPEDITION, HIS FLEET COMPLETED THE FIRST CIRCUMNAVIGATION OF THE GLOBE BETWEEN 1519 AND 1522. THIS JOURNEY DEMONSTRATED THE VASTNESS OF THE WORLD'S OCEANS AND PROVED THAT THE EARTH COULD BE CIRCLED BY SEA, FURTHER EXPANDING EUROPEAN MARITIME AMBITIONS.

ESTABLISHMENT OF GLOBAL TRADE NETWORKS

THIS SYSTEM HAD PROFOUND ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL CONSEQUENCES, INCLUDING THE ENTRENCHMENT OF SLAVERY AND THE RISE OF PLANTATION ECONOMIES.

INDIAN OCEAN TRADE

PORTUGUESE AND LATER DUTCH AND BRITISH POWERS ESTABLISHED CONTROL OVER KEY PORTS IN THE INDIAN OCEAN, INTEGRATING THE REGION MORE FIRMLY INTO GLOBAL TRADE NETWORKS. SPICES, TEXTILES, AND PRECIOUS METALS FLOWED

THROUGH THIS TRADE SYSTEM, LINKING EAST AFRICA, THE MIDDLE EAST, SOUTH ASIA, AND SOUTHEAST ASIA WITH EUROPE.

MERCANTILISM AND ECONOMIC POLICIES

EUROPEAN STATES ADOPTED MERCANTILIST POLICIES TO REGULATE TRADE AND ACCUMULATE WEALTH THROUGH COLONIES. GOVERNMENTS SOUGHT TO MAXIMIZE EXPORTS AND MINIMIZE IMPORTS, USING TARIFFS AND MONOPOLIES TO CONTROL COLONIAL ECONOMIES. THESE POLICIES FUELED COMPETITION AMONG EUROPEAN POWERS FOR OVERSEAS TERRITORIES AND TRADE DOMINANCE.

IMPACT OF EUROPEAN COLONIZATION

EUROPEAN CONTACT INTRODUCED DISEASES SUCH AS SMALLPOX, MEASLES, AND INFLUENZA TO INDIGENOUS POPULATIONS, WHO LACKED IMMUNITY. THE COLUMBIAN EXCHANGE AND ITS EFFECTS

THE COLUMBIAN EXCHANGE REFERS TO THE WIDESPREAD TRANSFER OF PLANTS, ANIMALS, PEOPLE, AND DISEASES BETWEEN THE OLD WORLD AND THE NEW WORLD FOLLOWING EUROPEAN CONTACT. THIS EXCHANGE HAD FAR-REACHING ECOLOGICAL AND SOCIAL IMPACTS DOCUMENTED THOROUGHLY IN AP WORLD HISTORY CHAPTER 13 NOTES.

TRANSFER OF PLANTS AND ANIMALS

NEW WEALTH FROM COLONIES STIMULATED THE GROWTH OF CAPITALISM AND FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS. JOINT-STOCK COMPANIES SUCH AS THE DUTCH EAST INDIA COMPANY FACILITATED INVESTMENT IN OVERSEAS VENTURES, SPREADING RISK AND INCREASING PROFITS. BANKING SYSTEMS EXPANDED TO SUPPORT THIS ECONOMIC ACTIVITY.

COMPETITION AND CONFLICT

EUROPEAN POWERS COMPETED FIERCELY FOR COLONIAL POSSESSIONS AND TRADE DOMINANCE, LEADING TO CONFLICTS SUCH AS THE ANGLO-SPANISH WAR AND DUTCH-PORTUGUESE CLASHES. THESE RIVALRIES SHAPED ALLIANCES AND MILITARY INNOVATIONS DURING THE PERIOD.
