THE RISE AND EXPANSION OF ISLAMIC CALIPHATES

ABBASID CALIPHATE AND CULTURAL FLOURISHING

THE ABBASID CALIPHATE (750–1258 CE) SHIFTED THE POLITICAL CENTER TO BAGHDAD, WHICH BECAME A HUB FOR INTELLECTUAL, SCIENTIFIC, AND CULTURAL ADVANCEMENTS. HUMAN ACTIVITY DURING THIS PERIOD LED TO DEFORESTATION, SOIL DEPLETION, AND CHANGES IN LAND USE PATTERNS. URBAN GROWTH INCREASED DEMAND FOR RESOURCES, WHICH SOMETIMES RESULTED IN ENVIRONMENTAL STRESS.
