KEY POLITICAL PHILOSOPHIES INFLUENCING AMERICAN GOVERNMENT

SEPARATION OF POWERS

MONTESQUIEU'S DOCTRINE OF SEPARATION OF POWERS ADVOCATED DIVIDING GOVERNMENT AUTHORITY AMONG LEGISLATIVE, EXECUTIVE, AND JUDICIAL BRANCHES TO PREVENT TYRANNY. THIS PRINCIPLE WAS INTEGRATED INTO THE U.S. CONSTITUTION TO ENSURE A SYSTEM OF CHECKS AND BALANCES, SAFEGUARDING INDIVIDUAL FREEDOMS AND MAINTAINING A BALANCED GOVERNMENT.

IMPORTANT COLONIAL DOCUMENTS AND THEIR IMPACT

THE MAGNA CARTA

THE ENGLISH BILL OF RIGHTS

ENACTED IN 1689, THE ENGLISH BILL OF RIGHTS FURTHER RESTRICTED THE POWERS OF THE MONARCHY AND AFFIRMED PARLIAMENTARY SUPREMACY. ITS GUARANTEES OF FREE ELECTIONS, FAIR TRIALS, AND FREEDOM FROM CRUEL PUNISHMENT RESONATED WITH AMERICAN COLONISTS AND INFLUENCED THEIR OWN DECLARATION OF RIGHTS.

COLONIAL CHARTERS AND COMPACTS

DOCUMENTS SUCH AS THE MAYFLOWER COMPACT AND VARIOUS COLONIAL CHARTERS ESTABLISHED SELF-GOVERNANCE AND COMMUNITY COOPERATION PRINCIPLES. THE MAYFLOWER COMPACT, FOR EXAMPLE, WAS AN EARLY SOCIAL CONTRACT AMONG SETTLERS, LAYING THE GROUNDWORK FOR DEMOCRATIC SELF-RULE.

THE ROAD TO INDEPENDENCE AND FORMATION OF GOVERNMENT

THE PATH FROM COLONIAL DEPENDENCE TO INDEPENDENT GOVERNANCE WAS MARKED BY A SERIES OF EVENTS THAT CHALLENGED BRITISH AUTHORITY AND UNITED THE COLONIES. THIS JOURNEY CULMINATED IN THE DRAFTING OF FOUNDATIONAL DOCUMENTS AND THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A NEW GOVERNMENT SYSTEM.

THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE

ADOPTED IN 1776, THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE FORMALLY ANNOUNCED THE COLONIES' BREAK FROM BRITAIN. IT ARTICULATED THE PHILOSOPHICAL FOUNDATIONS OF AMERICAN GOVERNMENT, EMPHASIZING INDIVIDUAL RIGHTS AND GOVERNMENT BY CONSENT.

ARTICLES OF CONFEDERATION

THE ARTICLES OF CONFEDERATION SERVED AS THE FIRST CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES, ESTABLISHING A LOOSE CONFEDERATION OF STATES WITH LIMITED CENTRAL AUTHORITY.
