ABIGAIL WILLIAMS

SHE IS MANIPULATIVE AND WILLING TO ACCUSE OTHERS OF WITCHCRAFT TO PROTECT HERSELF AND PURSUE HER AGENDA, PARTICULARLY HER DESIRE TO BE WITH JOHN PROCTOR. ABIGAIL'S ACTIONS HIGHLIGHT THEMES OF POWER, JEALOUSY, AND DECEIT THAT PERMEATE THE PLAY.

JOHN PROCTOR

THOUGH NOT THE PRIMARY FOCUS IN ACT 1, JOHN PROCTOR IS INTRODUCED AS A FARMER WITH A STRONG SENSE OF INTEGRITY AND SKEPTICISM TOWARD THE WITCH HUNT. HIS STRAINED RELATIONSHIP WITH ABIGAIL AND HIS MORAL STANCE FORESHADOW SIGNIFICANT DEVELOPMENTS IN LATER ACTS. PROCTOR REPRESENTS REASON AND RESISTANCE AGAINST MASS HYSTERIA.

OTHER NOTABLE CHARACTERS

- **BETTY PARRIS:** REVEREND PARRIS'S DAUGHTER WHOSE MYSTERIOUS ILLNESS SPARKS THE INITIAL WITCHCRAFT ACCUSATIONS.
