HISTORICAL PERIODS IN AMERICAN LITERATURE

REALISM AND NATURALISM

EMERGING IN THE LATE 19TH CENTURY, REALISM FOCUSED ON DEPICTING EVERYDAY LIFE ACCURATELY, OFTEN HIGHLIGHTING SOCIAL ISSUES AND THE LIVES OF ORDINARY PEOPLE. NATURALISM, A RELATED MOVEMENT, PORTRAYED HUMANS AS SUBJECT TO ENVIRONMENTAL AND HEREDITARY FORCES BEYOND THEIR CONTROL.

MODERNISM

THE EARLY 20TH CENTURY MODERNIST PERIOD IS CHARACTERIZED BY EXPERIMENTATION WITH STYLE AND FORM, REFLECTING THE COMPLEXITIES OF THE MODERN WORLD. THIS ERA INCLUDES FRAGMENTED NARRATIVES, SYMBOLISM, AND THEMES OF ALIENATION AND DISILLUSIONMENT FOLLOWING WORLD WAR I.

CONTEMPORARY LITERATURE

IDENTITY AND DIVERSITY

EXPLORATIONS OF RACE, ETHNICITY, GENDER, AND CULTURAL HERITAGE HIGHLIGHT AMERICA'S DIVERSE POPULATION. LITERATURE OFTEN ADDRESSES STRUGGLES FOR IDENTITY AND INCLUSION.

CONFLICT AND CHANGE

HISTORICAL AND SOCIAL CONFLICTS, SUCH AS WAR, SLAVERY, AND CIVIL RIGHTS MOVEMENTS, ARE COMMON THEMATIC ELEMENTS. THESE THEMES ILLUSTRATE THE NATION'S ONGOING EVOLUTION.

WASHINGTON IRVING

OFTEN CONSIDERED THE FIRST AMERICAN MAN OF LETTERS, IRVING'S WORKS SUCH AS "THE LEGEND OF SLEEPY HOLLOW" CONTRIBUTE TO EARLY AMERICAN FOLKLORE AND ROMANTICISM.

EMILY DICKINSON

A PIONEERING POET, DICKINSON'S CONCISE AND ENIGMATIC VERSES EXPLORE THEMES OF DEATH, IMMORTALITY, AND NATURE, INFLUENCING MODERN POETRY.

MARK TWAIN

TWAIN'S REALISTIC DEPICTIONS OF AMERICAN LIFE, ESPECIALLY IN "THE ADVENTURES OF HUCKLEBERRY FINN," CRITIQUE SOCIAL INJUSTICES AND HIGHLIGHT THE COMPLEXITIES OF FREEDOM AND MORALITY.

LANGSTON HUGHES

A LEADING FIGURE OF THE HARLEM RENAISSANCE, HUGHES' POETRY AND PROSE CELEBRATE AFRICAN AMERICAN CULTURE AND CHALLENGE RACIAL DISCRIMINATION.

TONI MORRISON

MORRISON'S NOVELS, INCLUDING "BELOVED," EXPLORE AFRICAN AMERICAN IDENTITY, HISTORY, AND TRAUMA WITH PROFOUND PSYCHOLOGICAL INSIGHT.

LITERARY DEVICES AND TECHNIQUES

UNDERSTANDING LITERARY DEVICES IS ESSENTIAL FOR ANALYZING EOC AMERICAN LITERATURE TEXTS. THESE TECHNIQUES ENHANCE MEANING, EVOKE EMOTIONS, AND CREATE DEPTH IN LITERARY WORKS.

SYMBOLISM

SYMBOLISM INVOLVES USING OBJECTS, CHARACTERS, OR EVENTS TO REPRESENT LARGER IDEAS. FOR EXAMPLE, THE GREEN LIGHT IN "THE GREAT GATSBY" SYMBOLIZES HOPE AND THE AMERICAN DREAM.

IMAGERY

IMAGERY USES DESCRIPTIVE LANGUAGE TO CREATE VIVID SENSORY EXPERIENCES, HELPING READERS VISUALIZE SCENES AND EMOTIONS.

IRONY

IRONY HIGHLIGHTS CONTRASTS BETWEEN APPEARANCE AND REALITY, OFTEN TO CRITIQUE SOCIETAL NORMS OR REVEAL DEEPER TRUTHS.

ALLUSION

ALLUSIONS REFERENCE OTHER LITERARY WORKS, HISTORICAL EVENTS, OR CULTURAL ELEMENTS TO ADD LAYERS OF MEANING.

POINT OF VIEW

THE NARRATOR'S PERSPECTIVE SHAPES THE READER'S UNDERSTANDING AND INTERPRETATION OF THE STORY, WHETHER FIRST-PERSON, THIRD-PERSON, OR OMNISCIENT.

STRATEGIES FOR ANALYZING EOC AMERICAN LITERATURE TEXTS

CLOSE READING

CLOSE READING INVOLVES CAREFUL EXAMINATION OF LANGUAGE, STRUCTURE, AND MEANING. PAYING ATTENTION TO WORD CHOICE, SYNTAX, AND LITERARY DEVICES REVEALS DEEPER INSIGHTS.

CONTEXTUAL UNDERSTANDING

CONSIDERING THE HISTORICAL AND CULTURAL CONTEXT OF A TEXT HELPS EXPLAIN ITS THEMES AND SIGNIFICANCE.

THEME IDENTIFICATION

RECOGNIZING CENTRAL THEMES AND HOW THEY DEVELOP THROUGHOUT A WORK IS CRITICAL FOR COMPREHENSIVE ANALYSIS.

CHARACTER ANALYSIS
