UNDERSTANDING PERSONIFICATION IN "NIGHT"

PERSONIFICATION IS A LITERARY DEVICE THAT ATTRIBUTES HUMAN TRAITS, EMOTIONS, OR INTENTIONS TO NON-HUMAN OBJECTS, ANIMALS, OR ABSTRACT IDEAS. DEFINITION AND PURPOSE OF PERSONIFICATION

PERSONIFICATION SERVES TO ANIMATE THE ENVIRONMENT AND ABSTRACT CONCEPTS, MAKING THEM RELATABLE AND IMPACTFUL. IN "NIGHT," WIESEL USES PERSONIFICATION TO DEPICT THE NIGHT ITSELF, THE CAMPS, AND EVEN DEATH AS ENTITIES WITH HUMAN-LIKE QUALITIES. PERSONIFICATION AS A REFLECTION OF THEMES

EXAMPLE 2: DEATH AS A COMPANION

ON PAGE 45, THE TEXT STATES, "DEATH WRAPPED ITSELF AROUND ME." DEATH IS PERSONIFIED AS AN ENTITY CAPABLE OF WRAPPING ITSELF AROUND SOMEONE, EMPHASIZING ITS OMNIPRESENCE AND INESCAPABILITY IN THE CONCENTRATION CAMPS. THIS VIVID PERSONIFICATION CONVEYS THE CONSTANT THREAT FACED BY THE PRISONERS.

EXAMPLE 3: THE SILENCE OF THE CAMPS

ON PAGE 67, WIESEL DESCRIBES, "THE SILENCE WAS DEAFENING." SILENCE IS GIVEN THE HUMAN QUALITY OF BEING CAPABLE OF DEAFENING, WHICH PARADOXICALLY INTENSIFIES THE FEELING OF ISOLATION AND FEAR. THIS PERSONIFICATION UNDERSCORES THE OPPRESSIVE ATMOSPHERE OF THE CAMPS.

EXAMPLE 4: THE FLAMES OF THE CREMATORIUM

ON PAGE 79, FLAMES ARE DESCRIBED AS "LICKING THE AIR HUNGRILY." THE FLAMES ARE PERSONIFIED WITH THE HUMAN ACTION OF LICKING AND THE EMOTION OF HUNGER, SYMBOLIZING THE DESTRUCTIVE AND CONSUMING NATURE OF THE HOLOCAUST MACHINERY.

EXAMPLE 5: THE BARBED WIRE

ON PAGE 52, THE BARBED WIRE IS SAID TO "WHISPERED THREATS." THIS PERSONIFICATION GIVES THE BARBED WIRE A SINISTER INTENT AND HUMAN VOICE, ENHANCING THE SENSE OF ENTRAPMENT AND MENACE EXPERIENCED BY THE PRISONERS.

SIGNIFICANCE OF PERSONIFICATION IN ENHANCING THEMES
